

Creative color wheel

Objective: I can create a creative color wheel.

Supplies

Paper – 12 x 18

Media – pen, pencil, charcoal, colored pencil, chalk pastel or oil pastel.

Information

The twelve colors on the color wheel are: red, orange, yellow, green, Blue , violet, yellow-orange, red-orange, yellow-green, blue-green, blue-violet and red-violet.

color wheel

Objective: To create and render a color wheel that is unique, creative and informative.

1. Research: Make a list of things that are round or oval. Make a list of things that have sections.
2. Process: Pick an image that is round or oval which can be broken into sections. This image will become the color wheel.
3. Render the image in pencil, then finish in pen and ink, pencil or charcoal.
4. Color the color wheel using colored pencil, chalk pastel or oil pastel.
5. Try to create a color wheel that is unique, creative, one of a kind, or personal to you.
6. Neatly, using pen, write the names of all of the colors next to the corresponding color.

Requirements:

1. The work must be clean and neat.
2. The work must be somewhat oval or round so that the colors are organized in a color wheel format. (The colors must be presented logically. If you want to do something creative but it is not oval or round, make sure that the colors and their correct order on the color wheel can be determined.)
3. The work must have a background.
4. Coloring must be smooth or be appropriate for the work. (Texture is allowed if you are rendering fur, wood, etc.)
5. The only whites allowed on the work are highlights.
6. The colors must follow a traditional color wheel format. Twelve colors must be used.
7. Any shading should be smooth unless texture is use. The texture must be appropriate.
8. Paper must be 12 x 12 or larger.
9. The colors must be neatly labeled.

Art 2 and above have an extra requirement:

The color wheel must incorporate shades and tints.
