



One point perspective house info sheet. How to draw a House in one point perspective.


1. Draw a horizon line and put in a vanishing point
2. Draw a square or rectangle for the facing side of the house.




3. Draw perspective guide lines to the VP.
4. Cut off the house to the length you desire with a vertical and horizontal line.





5. Darken in the perspective line for the front side of the house.
6. To find the mid point of a plane, intersect the corners or x it. Do this to the front side of the house. This finds the mid point so that you can put in the roof.
7. Draw a Guide line up from the mid point to just above the horizon line.




8. Draw diagonal lines from the top point of the roof to the sides of the front side.
9. Draw a horizontal line to make the roof top.(To find out where to end this line, extend the midpoint of the front of the house to the back plane and make a vertical guide line to intersect the top of the roof. Where the lines intersect will be the end of the roof line.)
10. Draw a diagonal – parallel line, to the roof, to finish the roof.



- 11. Window – Draw a line to start the window.
- 12. Draw guide lines to the VP from the top and bottom of that line.
- 13. Draw a vertical line to end the window. Darken in the window lines.



- 14. Draw the starting line for a door. Draw a perspective line to the VP at the top of the door. Draw a vertical line ending the door.



15. Side walk – draw two perspective lines in front of the house.

16. Horizontal lines get smaller and closer together as they recede to the VP.
