


Basic one point perspective room – how to draw one. *Art ITV Bailey*

Objective: Create a room interior using one point perspective. I can use linear perspective to create a one point room.


Supplies: A piece of paper 12 x 12 inches, a ruler, pencil, eraser

Procedure:

1. Cut a piece of paper 12 x 12 inches.
2. Draw a large X from corner to corner with the ruler. This will find the middle of the paper. Draw lightly
3. Put your ruler on one of the lines with the 2 inch mark on the center of the x. Mark 2 inches on both sides of the line. Repeat on the other line. This should give you two line segments that are 4 inches each.
4. Connect the dots the best that you can with horizontal and vertical lines, which will create a box.




5. You now have a floor, ceiling, two side walls and a back wall. On the floor, at the bottom of the page, make a mark every inch.




You don't have to draw the lines past the end of the floor. My lines are going to the VP as an example. If you want the back wall to be solid, stop the lines at the end of the floor.


5. Draw a diagonal line between the front left corner of the floor to the back right corner of the floor. This line will cross all of the oblique lines.



The diagonal line crosses all of the VP lines on the floor. Use these intersection points as guides to draw horizontal lines. This will create a checker board floor in perspective.



This completes the floor of the basic one point perspective room.



The objects in the room will be a hallway, an arched door, a painting, a window, a skylight, a couch, and a table.
